### 壹、 緣起

Compared to other universities in the USA, such as Georgia Tech, it is not a really big college. It also means the class size is small, and students can have a good interaction with the professor. Georgia college is helping students discover what truly drives their spirit and learn how to develop their talents to make a difference in the world. There are also many school activities for students in Georgia College, including clubs, sports, volunteer opportunities and more. You will learn a lot of knowledge and make many memorable experienced throughout your college life in GCSU.

The professor is really nice and try to use different and interesting methods to teach us instead of just sitting on the chair to listen what the teacher talking about. For example, I used chalk on the road outside the classroom to draw cartoons on educational issues with my classmates. That is a very new and interesting experience for me.

#### Food:

#### • Meal plan

You can use your meal plan in the Max which is a student cafeteria. I bought 25 blocks for one semester. Of course, it is not enough, but you can buy another one after you finish it. You can also use your catcash to buy a meal at the counter. It will cost you \$8.55 for breakfast, and around \$10 for lunch and dinner if you buy it from the counter. I totally ate 65 meals in the Max this semester. There are also many options for you to choose for your meal plan, it depends on you.

#### • Downtown

Downtown is near the school, there are some good restaurants you can try.

#### Around Milledgeville mall


There are many restaurants around Milledgeville mall. If you are tired of eating the Max food, you can take a shuttle bus to there and find something good to eat on google maps. For example, Chipotle and Taco Bell is very delicious Mexican food restaurant. Kai Thai is also good.

#### • Cook by yourself

All of the dorms have a kitchen. You can buy some food from Walmart and cook by yourself.

#### **Dorms:**

There are many dorms for you to choose in Georgia College, it depends on your needs and priorities. The price of each option is different. The sections circled by the red square are the dorms that you can apply for. From Adams to the main campus where students usually have class, you need to walk around 7 minutes. Georgia College also has shuttle bus for students to go to the main campus, so you don't need to walk every time. Before you go to Georgia college, you will receive an email from International Office, and then you can follow the instruction to choose which dorm you like.



#### • Main campus dorms:

If you like to participate in many school activities and do not want to walk very far away to the classroom, Bell Hall is the best choice for you. Bell hall has many interesting people and activities, and it is the most active residence hall in Georgia college. I truly recommend exchange students to live in Bell Hall. The basement and internet lounge is the best place for you to make friends. If you don't live in Bell, you must need a friend who live in Bell Hall, and you can make and meet many friendly people and friends.


All dorms on the main campus have single and double room for you to choose. You will have at least one suitemate with you to share the bathroom. If you want to do your laundry, they also have a laundry room in the dorms. It costs \$1.25 to wash clothes, and \$0.5 to dry clothes for 30 minutes. They don't have space for you to hang out your laundry. In addition, they don't have public fridge, you'll be very lucky if your roommate has a fridge. You can also borrow it from the school website or buy a small one from Walmart. On the first day, the international office will take you to Walmart to buy some daily necessities. After that day, you can also take the school shuttle to Walmart to buy everything you need by yourself.

#### • West village:

West village is located on the West campus. If you do not have car, it is very difficult for you to walk to there. (no one will do that) The only way you can go there is take the school shuttle or ask someone give you a drive. If you cannot catch the shuttle, it will be very inconvenient.

West village is very different from the main campus dorm. They have a kitchen, fridge and microwave in their room. I think it is less like a college dorm, and more like a family home. I think the west village has the best living quality among all the dorms, but it is too far away from the classroom.

#### **School Shuttle:**



The school shuttle has 3 routes, respectively west campus (blue), late night (red) and shopping line (green). The bus stops and time schdule of each routes are different. For details, you can refer to the following website:

The nearest airport to the school is in Atlanta. You need to drive 2 hours to get there. There is no public transportation in Milledgeville, so you need to ask your friends for drive. You can take an airplane and travel to another state during spring break and holiday. It is easy to travel to another state in the USA, but it is better for you to go with your friends.
